

CALL to Confession

If we say we are completely put together, the truth is not in us.

But if we confess our distractions, our errors, and our anxieties, God will meet us and renew us. Together let us confess our sins against God and one another.

Imitating the cadence of the Sermon on the Mount, the Prayer of Confession pairs blessings and woes as a way to compare what draws us near to God vs. what pulls us away.

This chorus from a popular contemporary song is frequently used as a response to all kinds of prayer. Here we use it as a response to confession, but it could as easily be used as part of a pastoral or Eucharistic prayer as well.

Blessed are we when we let go of possessions for the kingdom of God unfolds in open places.

Woe to us when we gather into barns for soon this life will be over.

Blessed are we who know the ache of hunger for the empty places in body and soul are the fertile soil for new growth.

Blessed are we who know sorrow for the ache of love lost is witness to the seed planted.

NEW TESTAMENT READING

Matthew 5:1-20

Now when Jesus saw the crowds, he went up a mountain. He sat down and his disciples came to him. He taught them, saying:

"Happy are people who are hopeless, because the kingdom of heaven is theirs.

"Happy are people who grieve, because they will be made glad.

"Happy are people who are humble, because they will inherit the earth.

"Happy are people who are hungry and thirsty for righteousness, because they will be fed until they are full.

"Happy are people who show mercy, because they will receive mercy.

"Happy are people who have pure hearts, because they will see God.

"Happy are people who make peace, because they will be called God's children.

"Happy are people whose lives are harassed because they are righteous, because the kingdom of heaven is theirs.

"Happy are you when people insult you and harass you and speak all kinds of bad and false things about you, all because of me. Be full of joy and be glad, because you have a great reward in heaven. In the same way, people harassed the prophets who came before you.

"You are the salt of the earth. But if salt loses its saltiness, how will it become salty again? It's good for nothing except to be thrown away and trampled under people's feet. You are the light of the world. A city on top of a hill can't be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a basket. Instead, they put it on top of a lampstand, and it shines on all who are in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before people, so they can see the good things you do and praise your Father who is in heaven.

"Don't even begin to think that I have come to do away with the Law and the Prophets. I haven't come to do away with them but to fulfill them. I say to you very seriously that as long as heaven and earth exist, neither the smallest letter nor even the smallest stroke of a pen will be erased from the Law until everything there becomes a reality. Therefore, whoever ignores one of the least of these commands and teaches others to do the same will be called the lowest in the kingdom of heaven. But whoever keeps these commands and teaches people to keep them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. I say to you that unless your righteousness is greater

Prayers of/for the People are a common feature in worship. Although the Book Common Worship includes several iterations of this kind of prayer, many churches have original prayers written for each week or a spontaneous prayer may be offered. There is no single right or wrong way in terms of liturgical theology. Importantly, the prayer should reflect the values of the community of faith and honestly reflect its character.

God often speaks through unusual voices. In the bible, God frequently speaks to the people of Israel through "the nations."

Here the prayer uses the cultural pressures of our world as places where God's voice may still be heard.

The Spirit's gifts are here to stay in rich variety—fitting responses to timely needs.

We thankfully see each other as gifted members of the fellowship which delights in the creative Spirit's work.

He gives more than enough to each believer for God's praise and our neighbor's welfare.

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE AND THE LORD'S PRAYER

God of true happiness, of light and life:

When we see with the lens of faith,

we behold the wonder of creation.
