Together let us confess our sins against God and one another.


PRAYER OF CONFESSION (RESPONSIVE)

### WE PROCLAIM GOD'S WORD

#### New Testament Reading

#### Matthew 25:31-46

"Now when the Human One comes in his majesty and all his angels are with him, he will sit on his majestic throne. All the nations will be gathered in front of him. He will separate them from each other, just as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will put the sheep on his right side. But the goats he will put on his left.

"Then the king will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who will receive good things from my Father. Inherit the kingdom that was prepared for you before the world began. I was hungry and you gave me food to eat. I was thirsty and you gave me a drink. I was a stranger and you welcomed me. I was naked and you gave me clothes to wear. I was sick and you took care of me. I was in prison and you visited me.'

The apocalyptic discourse in Matthew 25 is the basis for the new Matthew 25 initiative in the Presbyterian Church (USA). Rooted in Jesus' revelation that when we serve "the least of these" we serve him, Matthew 25 focuses on three key principles:

- Building Vital Congregations
- Dismantling Structural Racism
- Eradicating Systemic Poverty

Each congregation that joins the Matthew 25 movement is invited to tailor the program to their own circumstance.

At WHPC we participate in the program through mission focus, public witness, and our newly formed Matthew 25 team that is exploring issues of congregational vitality.

"Then those who are righteous will reply to him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you a drink? When did we see you as a stranger and welcome you, or naked and give you clothes to wear? When did we see you sick or in prison and visit you?'

"Then the king will reply to them, 'I assure you that when you have done it for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you have done it for me.'

"Then he will say to those on his left, 'Get away from me, you who will receive terrible things. Go into the unending fire that has been prepared for the devil and his angels. I was hungry and you didn't give me food to eat. I was thirsty and you didn't give me anything to drink. I was a stranger and you didn't welcome me. I was naked and you didn't give me clothes to wear. I was sick and in prison, and you didn't visit me.'

"Then they will reply, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison and didn't do anything to help you?' Then he will answer, 'I assure you that when you haven't done it for one of the least of these, you haven't done it for me.' And they will go away into eternal punishment. But the righteous ones will go into eternal life."

**ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING- SDOP HELPS FORMERLY INCARCERATED WOMEN** SDOP, Self-Development of People, has helped Why Not Prosper, which is comprised of formerly incarcerated women building up other women who've experienced incarceration. "...the Rev. Dr. Michelle Simmons, the founder of that group, discusses their Anti-Violence Campaign, which addresses violence in the Germantown community in Philadelphia. The program includes female-led peace patrollers who walk the community every second Monday to hand out 'love bags' and listen to the concerns of neighbors. "The assistance [from SDOP] has been invaluable, as it has helped us to hire a coordinator, which facilitates the carrying out of our day-to-day activities," Simmons said. "Since SDOP is a national organization, it has also helped us to gain credibility through national recognition." Ms. Simmons "explained why she appreciates SDOP's unique support: 'It funds projects where the person who has suffered from the problem at hand is the same one leading the charge to correct the problem.'"
