Matthew 28:1-10

After the Sabbath, at dawn on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to look at the tomb. Look, there was a great earthquake, for an angel from the Lord came down from heaven. Coming to the stone, he rolled it away and sat on it. Now his face was like lightning and his clothes as white as snow. The guards were so terrified of him that they shook with fear and became like dead men. But the angel said to the women, "Don't be afraid. I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He isn't here, because he's been raised from the dead, just as he said. Come, see the place where they laid him. Now hurry, go and tell his disciples, 'He's been raised from the dead. He's going on ahead of you to Galilee. You will see him there.' I've given the message to you."

With great fear and excitement, they hurried away from the tomb and ran to tell his disciples. But Jesus met them and greeted them. They came and grabbed his feet and worshipped him. Then Jesus said to them, "Don't be afraid. Go and tell my brothers that I am going into Galilee. They will see me there."

Adapted from the Belhar Confession

We believe:

that Christ's work of reconciliation is made manifest in the church as the community of believers who have been reconciled with God and with one another;

that this unity must become visible so that the world may believe that separation, enmity and hatred between people and groups is sin and must be resisted;

that this unity of the people of God must be manifested and be active in a variety of ways;

- in that we love one another;
- that we experience, practice, and pursue community with one another;
- that we are obligated to give ourselves willingly and joyfully to be of benefit and blessing to one another.

We confess these things in the hope of the risen Christ who calls us to unity, fellowship, and peace.

Like the other gospels, Matthew describes a scene where the women who followed Jesus arrive before others. Despite what some traditions would claim, women have been teaching since the very first moments of the church!

The one distinction in Matthew's account is that Jesus speaks directly to the disciples once they arrive and they recognize him. He says to them, "Greetings."

The Belhar Confession was adopted as part of the Presbyterian Church (USA) Book

of Confessions in 2016.

Composer Lloyd Larson, graduate of both Anderson University and Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, KY, is a noted piano and choral composer.



+Parting Hymn "Christ Has Risen While Earth Slumbers" SUO GAN


This traditional Welsh melody literally translates to "lullaby" or "lull song." The origins are unclear, however the tune was recorded on paper as early as 1800 and the text of the lullaby by the mid 1800's.

The text of the lullaby is focused on the safety the child is invited to feel in the loving care of a parent's watchful eye.

This modern text by John Bell and Graham Maule begins with traditional Easter imagery but continues to less traditional claims about the breadth of the promise found in resurrection. In the third verse, the hymn even says that Christ is risen for "all whose lives are messed and mangled, all who find religion strange."

Easter is not the end of the season of Lent but the beginning of the season of resurrection and new life.

Our prayer for you today is that you encounter newness of life and renewal in your spirit in the coming days and weeks. In this broken and hurting world, please take a little time to share some light and love with the world.

SESSION NOTES FROM THE APRIL SESSION MEETING

• Approved minutes from the 1-22-23 congregational meeting, 2-12-23 session meeting, and 3-5-23 called meeting to receive new members.

• Gave permission to Presbyterians for Earthcare to use the New Chapel on September 21 as a remote viewing location for their national conference.

♦ Approved the dates for Treats and Treasures set-up and sale. The sale is the weekend of August 12.

 \blacklozenge Received reports from the pastor, committees, and deacons.

•Acted to adopt a final 2023 budget. The budget reflects adjustments to several line items to reflect the increased cost of operations and utilities. The budget also incorporates the salary increases for support staff approved to start in January. The total operating budget (including debt maintenance on the mortgage) is \$391,353. This total represents a projected deficit of \$25,863. The session has approved a short supplemental stewardship campaign for April to close this small gap in funding.

Approved financial statements through February. NB: Financial statements are available to all members by request.

• Adopted a policy concerning religious leaders of other traditions who have been expelled or excluded from ministry while under investigation.

♦ Named the Friths as delegates to the Presbyterian Village Assembly for supporting congregations.

•Heard a report from the Matthew 25 Church Vitality group about plans for a May congregation-wide supper. Details and dates will follow in the CareLine.

•Named four elders to develop a process for new member orientation and welcome. Members include Ray Stephens, Liz Branch, Roy Nash, and Julie Naylor.

•Named two elders to work with other knowledgeable members of the church to develop a plan for re-launched Fellowship ministry. Members include Betty Glenn and Tammy Pflug. *NB: Like many churches, Westover's Fellowship ministry processes and procedures were deeply impacted by COVID shutdowns. As has been expressed by many members, Fellowship ministry is essential.*

• Approved the application of "The Collective," a discernment group considering forming a new Presbyterian worshiping community focused on LGBTQIA+ people. This group, led by Rev. Marie Mainard O'Connell, meets monthly for fellowship and a potluck as well as other occasional gatherings. Their leadership team, "The People," meet monthly in the Hardie Chapel. Pastor Robert and Rev. Michael Gallup of the Table are both members of the discernment group. *NB: If approved for the discernment seed grant, Westover Hills will be the only PC(USA) church in the nation with two 1001 New Worship Communities under one roof. To learn more about the Table and the Collective, see the newsletter mailed to homes this week.*
