

and with you.



The legendary folk trio of Peter Yarrow, Paul Stookey, and Mary Travers, known as Peter, Paul, and Mary, are one of the best known and iconic contributors to American folk music.

sang both original compositions and some of the most iconic music of the 1960's folk era. At the March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom, best known for Dr. King's "I Have a Dream" speech, they performed the Pete Seeger song "If I Had a Hammer" and the Bob Dylan classic "Blowin' in the Wind."

The trio broke up in 1970 but would reunite for special concerts and performances. They reunited more or less permanently from 1981-2009 until Travers died of complications following treatment for leukemia.

Puff, the magic dragon lived by the sea And frolicked in the autumn mist in a land called Honah Lee

The song "Puff the Magic Dragon" is one of the trio's best known hits. The music was written by Peter Yarrow to accompany a poem by 19-year old Cornell student Leonard Lipton.

A 1964 Newsweek article speculated that the song was about drug use. Responding to the article, both Yarrow and Lipton said that the song was about the difficulties of growing up and letting go of childhood innocence in an increasingly cynical and troubled world. Despite their denials, the rumor has persisted.

The song was adapted into an animated TV special in 1978. Burgess Meredith voiced the character of Puff. In December 2016, Fox announced plans for a live-action/animation film based on the song. As of today, no progress has been made on that project.

SERMON "A Theology of Gladness"

Dr. Lowry

The Heidelberg Catechism was written in 1563 in the German city of Heidelberg, one of the few Calvinist outposts in Lutheran Germany. The traditional authors are thought to be Zacharias Ursinius and Caspar Olevianus, however research has shown that it was likely a team of theologians working together under the guidance of Frederick III, the Elector of the Province of the Palatinate from 1559-1576.

The Westminster Shorter Catechism was written in 1646/47 by the Westminster Assembly meeting in London. The synod of English and Scottish theologians was intended to bring the Church of England into greater conformity with the Church of Scotland.


He is a prolific writer of hymns rooted in Psalms. This composition utilizes Psalm 45 as the basis of the paraphrased text.
