

Silence is kept.







In 1983 when the UPCUSA and the PCUS merged to form the PC (USA) it was decided that a new confession of faith celebrating the reunion of the two branches of Presbyterianism and articulating a modern sense of our core theological convictions was needed.

The result was "A Brief Statement of Faith." Written in a trinitarian formula like the Apostles' and Nicene creeds, this confessional statement was added officially to the constitution of the church in the late 1980's.
