Thank you for Your faithful presence among us,


even when we are not fully aware of it.

When we face the foolish wisdom of the looming cross; like Peter, we suggest an alternative.


Meet us in our disbelieving, loving God, move us gently into the deep waters of faith.

PRAYER FOR ILLUMINATION

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Genesis 18:1-15, 21:1-7

The nature of the Hebrew Bible is to recall history without always smoothing out all the disjointed sections that occur when disparate oral traditions were brought together. Some scholars argue that this is intentional as a literary device to drive home a larger theme concerning the nature and character of God.

The completed form of the Genesis text is the story of a single childless couple who are promised a son. By the end of the book of Genesis, sixty-six persons belong to this lineage. This is enough to ensure both durability and influence.

The Lord appeared to Abraham near the great trees of Mamre while he was sitting at the entrance to his tent in the heat of the day. Abraham looked up and saw three men standing nearby. When he saw them, he hurried from the entrance of his tent to meet them and bowed low to the ground.

He said, "If I have found favor in your eyes, my lord, do not pass your servant by. Let a little water be brought, and then you may all wash your feet and rest under this tree. Let me get you something to eat, so you can be refreshed and then go on your way—now that you have come to your servant."

"Very well," they answered, "do as you say."

So Abraham hurried into the tent to Sarah. "Quick," he said, "get three seahs of the finest flour and knead it and bake some bread."

Then he ran to the herd and selected a choice, tender calf and gave it to a servant, who hurried to prepare it. He then brought some curds and milk and the calf that had been prepared, and set these before them. While they ate, he stood near them under a tree.

"Where is your wife Sarah?" they asked him.

"There, in the tent," he said.

Then one of them said, "I will surely return to you about this time next year, and Sarah your wife will have a son."

Now Sarah was listening at the entrance to the tent, which was behind him. Abraham and Sarah were already very old, and Sarah was past the age of childbearing. So Sarah laughed to herself as she thought, "After I am worn out and my lord is old, will I now have this pleasure?"

Then the Lord said to Abraham, "Why did Sarah laugh and say, "Will I really have a child, now that I am old?' Is anything too hard for the Lord? I will return to you at the appointed time next year, and Sarah will have a son."

Sarah was afraid, so she lied and said, "I did not laugh."

But he said, "Yes, you did laugh."

A funny scene unfolds at the end of the story of the Annunciation of Isaac. Sarah, unable to believe what she hears, laughs. She laughs in the face of the messengers of God. Then, when her laughter is pointed out, she denies having laughed to which the messengers reply, "Oh yes, you did laugh."

The Hebrew in this place is less formal than the above translation implies. The messenger of God looks at Sarah, likely with disbelief, and says, "Um, yeah ya did!" Sarah's expression must have been something like that of a child caught with a hand in the cookie jar trying to deny they were reaching for a cookie!

The Lord was attentive to Sarah just as he had said, and the Lord carried out just what he had promised her. She became pregnant and gave birth to a son for Abraham when he was old, at the very time God had told him. Abraham named his son—the one Sarah bore him—Isaac. Abraham circumcised his son Isaac when he was eight days old just as God had commanded him. Abraham was 100 years old when his son Isaac was born. Sarah said, "God has given me laughter. Everyone who hears about it will laugh with me." She said, "Who could have told Abraham that Sarah would nurse sons? But now I've given birth to a son when he was old!"

And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors.


And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
