Isaiah 40:1-11

Midweek Manna



Reverse Advent Calendars

This year for the season of Advent we have adopted a "reverse Advent calendar" program to benefit our mission partners. While a traditional Advent calendar has a little treat hidden for each day of the season, the reverse Advent calendar is an invitation to *add* a little treat for one of our neighbors in need. There will also be weekly reflections, a suggested way to offer a gesture of love and goodwill each Saturday, and a special prayer request for each Sunday of Advent.

Each weekday you are invited to add to your reverse Advent calendar bag an item that is needed by one of our partners. This may be a bag of dry beans for El Zócalo or a pair of mittens for the Mitten Tree. Each item on the list has been identified by our partners as a particular need for either the season or on an ongoing basis. We will collect the bags on Christmas Eve at our candlelight service and offer a blessing over them. If you are unable to attend or will be travelling, you may bring your filled bags by the church before Christmas Eve or after January 1.
